

Mayor's Message....



At our Village Board meeting on March 7, we approved a budget of \$21,341,101 for Fiscal Year 2018-19, a 1.02% increase over the current budget. The new budget goes into effect on May 1, 2018.

Our budget process actually started in October when the Department Managers met with the Finance Director with their initial proposals for the 2018-19 Fiscal Year. In addition, the Board reviews and provides input on the five-year capital budget. This budget includes requests for projects, new equipment and vehicle replacement.

The Finance Director uses the input from the managers to develop a preliminary budget which is then reviewed and revised by the management team.

At this point, the management team then held individual meetings with the Trustees to get their comments on the budget. The tentative budget, which included the recommendations from the Trustees, was presented at a public hearing on February 7, 2018, for residents' comments.

Therefore, when the Board of Trustees approved the final 2018-19 budget on March 7, countless hours had been dedicated to developing the budget. The Board and I would like to thank the Village Staff for the great work they did in developing our budget, especially Robbie Day, Finance Director.

This budget has a small increase in property taxes of \$49,000. Our Workers Compensation premium has dropped by \$12,600 because we have not had a claim in the past 12 years. We are projecting an increase of 20% in health insurance premiums later this year when our policy renews. We will be increasing water rates by 6% and sewer rates by 3% per the Financial Management Plan recommendation by our consultant, Ehlers. Due to a change at the State level, we brought the overweight funds in to support general fund activities and paying for bonds from the general funds.

Capital improvement projects that we anticipate completing in the fiscal year include the replacement of the street lights in the Wooded Cove subdivision, securing the records department in the Police Department and making improvements to the police parking lot including the addition of a fence and a car port. Repairs are planned for the Village Hall and we will be doing some pavement rejuvenation and markings.

We plan to connect our water system to Joliet's water system to provide redundancy for our system. If our water tower would have to be taken out of service for repairs, etc, the connection to the Joliet system would allow uninterrupted service for the village and insure public safety needs are met.

We have moved up the timetable for a water main improvement project for the Shady Nook area from Spring of 2019 to this Spring. The temporary repairs we made to the water line, this winter, only served as a short-term solution, so we feel we need to move forward with running a new 8-inch waterline under Route 53 at St. Louis Street. We have adjusted the budget to reflect this additional project.

ComEd to Install Smart Meters Starting in April

ComEd crews plan to be in the Village of Elwood starting in April 2018 to install smart meters at all homes and businesses in the area. This phase of installation is expected to end in August 2018.

Installations will be performed by a uniformed meter installer with appropriate identification from ComEd or a ComEd-authorized contractor, Corix or MZI Group. Contact the police department if you have a concern about the installer.

A smart meter is a digital electric meter that securely sends energy-usage information to ComEd. ComEd will be installing smart meters that are certified by Underwriters Laboratories, further demonstrating the meters are safe and reliable.

Smart meters help eliminate estimated bills and reduce operating costs that become savings on your energy bills. Residential customers with smart meters have access to energy-management tools, high-usage alerts and weekly reports summarizing daily energy use to help them manage their energy bills.

They can also enroll in ComEd's Peak Time Savings and Hourly Pricing programs and save money by voluntarily shifting energy use to times where there is less demand. Additional money-saving programs that use smart meter information may be available through other electric suppliers.

Smart meters are important building blocks of the smart grid that is providing customers with faster restoration

times by notifying ComEd when an outage occurs and when power has been restored.

Smart meters will be installed in all homes and businesses across northern Illinois by the end of 2018. Homes and businesses scheduled for smart meter installations will receive information from ComEd explaining how the installation process will work and how customers can use smart meters to manage their energy use.
