## Waste Management Yard Waste Collection

Yard Waste will be collected once per week on the same day as the refuse collection from April 1st through November 30th. All yard waste materials must be placed in "Kraft" paper bags designed and sold specifically for the collection and disposal of yard waste. Yard waste placed in plastic bags or ridged containers will not be accepted.



## Public Works Brush Pickup

Brush pickup is available to residents at no cost once a month April through October during the last week of the month. Brush pickup includes small bush and tree trimmings or debris from storm damage. No pick up will be made for large tree removal. Please bundle and stack the brush neatly on the parkway.

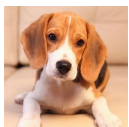

More than one-third of U.S. households own at least one dog. That's why it's so important for everyone to recognize that any dog can bite, that nearly 1 in 5 dog bites requires medical attention, and that in addition to injuries, dog bites can cause serious infection and even death.

## Nuisance



The Village of Elwood has experienced an increase in residential complaints in reference to nuisance animals. Recently several residents expressed concerns about an overabundance of skunks populating the residential areas throughout the village.

Any officer responding to a nuisance animal call will make the necessary arrangements for the property owner to consent to the placement of a trap. The Village of Elwood will be the principle billed party and shall pay for the service.

## Winterization of Park Facilities:

In preparation for winter, public works will be turning off all water to our facilities the week of October 22<sup>nd</sup> 2018 (bathrooms, gardens, etc.) to avoid having lines freeze.

## Beware of Bats Exposure of Rabies



As bats become more active, the Illinois Department of Public Health is reminding people to beware of potentially rabid bats and other animals. Although most bats are not infected with rabies, it's important to avoid handling bats, get and keep your pets vaccinated and make sure your home has no openings where bats can come in."

You can't tell just by looking at a bat if it has rabies. Only in instances when a person or pet has been exposed to a bat will the bat need to be tested for rabies.

If you find yourself near a bat (in your home or other indoor area) close the door to the room where the bat is and call the local health department. They can help determine if you could have been exposed to rabies and if the bat needs to be tested.

If you are bitten by a bat or other animal, you should seek medical attention immediately.
