Thank you for the privilege of serving such a great community.





ELWOOD CCSD 203 UPDATES ITS STRATEGIC PLAN

Elwood CCSD has a new and improved Strategic Plan for 2024-2029! Elwood officially adopts this plan in August. Elwood's current Strategic Plan has been in place since 2021, but technically expires in 2024. Superintendent Page began organizing the update back in April. The new and improved plan was developed through community meetings, committee meetings, surveys of staff and the community, and multiple conversations with stakeholders done over the last four to five months. The Plan focuses on Communication, Curriculum and Technology, Parental Involvement, Climate and Safety, and beginning this year has a new area of focus for the Elwood School Facilities. There are some bigger ticket items coming up for the Elwood School Building. This summer, Elwood renovated the gymnasium which has a history of safety concerns with the previous wood floor. In the next couple of years, there are plans to completely redo the parking lots, the bus barn, and the school library. The new Strategic Plan will be officially unveiled at the Board Meeting on August 13 at 6:00pm in the school library.
