My wife Lisa and I look forward to enjoying life in this community where we were raised. We'll partake in the ongoing prosperity this village has earned through hard work and commitment.

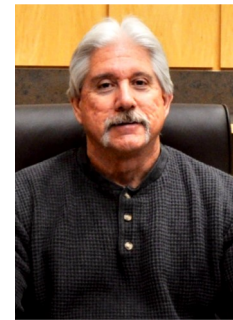

This will give you an entire season of all the locally grown fresh produce you can eat, and it will save you about 20% off supermarket prices. Think of it as a subscription for farm fresh produce.

Will County TRIAD is a three - way commitment among the chiefs of police in a county, the sheriff and older or retired leaders. They agree to work together to reduce the criminal victimization of the elderly and enhance the delivery of law enforcement services to older persons.

A major purpose of a TRIAD is to develop, expand and implement effective crime prevention and education programs for older community members. Activities center on both pre - victimization (preventive) and post - victimization (victim / witness assistance) aspects.

TRIAD works to improve the quality of life for seniors. By providing an opportunity for the exchange of information between law enforcement and older persons, Triad can also focus on reducing unwarranted fear of crime.
